
Fleet Week and Alcatraz - Saturday, October 6

Scout Master Minute

It occurred to me this summer that just as there are seven days at summer camp there are also seven years in a typical youth scout program. Just as each summer camp has a beginning, middle, and end, so does the seven years of the scouting program.

When a scout joins our Troop it takes a little time to become oriented and to learn the lay of the land, much like the first day of summer camp. Very quickly however most scouts catch on and dive into the program and participate in the fun stuff.

Towards the middle some of the work kicks in and scouts need to start working. At summer camp they may have Merit Badge homework and in the Troop this is their time to lead events as Scout in Charge and take on intermediate leadership positions such as Troop Guide, Instructor, Quartermaster, etc.

At the end the scouts start to diverge in their paths. Some scramble to finish their work before the calendar runs out while others find activities to enjoy knowing that their work is done.

Sometimes the work does not get done on time. For a summer camp Merit Badge a partial may not be critical because a scout can complete the merit badge after summer camp, although that task becomes much more difficult. For the program however, there is no chance to complete your Eagle after age 18. You have to ask yourself what kind of scouting career do you want to have? Do you want to postpone your last 5 Eagle required Merit Badges until your final year along with your project and perhaps earn your Eagle Rank a few days before your 18th Birthday or do you want to stay on target and enjoy the trail to Eagle and reach the top of the mountain with a little time to enjoy the view before you age out?

Remember too, you are not the only person involved in your journey to Eagle. For your Eagle Project you need to show leadership in service which includes rallying others to give their time to your project. There are Troop leaders who you will need to go to for guidance, conferences, and signatures. You will also need to make appointments with people at the Council level. A scout is Courteous and will allow time for adult type people who volunteer their time to help them in a non-crisis timeframe.

Contrapositively, I would also like to ask that everyone associated with the Troop, youth and adults, to mentally prepare yourselves for a year of service. There may be as many as 11 Eagle Projects between now and June. These events are always extra to the published calendar and often planned only 4 – 6 weeks out. These scouts have given their time and leadership to the program and will now be asking for your help for them and the various beneficiary organizations. While giving service to an Eagle project is a reward in itself, there is a circle of Eagle projects as the younger boys help the older boys, so too will the future members of Troop 726 help those who are the younger boys now.

Please join us in another fun year filled with fun events and Eagle Projects – Mr. Avery







Philmont Scout Ranch is the Boy Scouts of America's largest national high-adventure base. It covers 137,000 acres - about 214 square miles - of rugged mountain wilderness in the Sangre de Cristo (Blood of Christ) range of the Rocky Mountains in northern New Mexico. Thirty-four staffed camps and 55 trail camps are operated by the ranch. Philmont has high mountains dominating rough terrain with elevations ranging from 6,500 to 12,441 feet.

Kenji Pinzon, Mitch Avery, and Raymond Akagi and Mr. Andrews joined members of Venture Crew 168 for a 14-day long (July 26 through August 8), fantastic, once-in-a-life time high adventure trip in the sky-high backpacking country. 
