(The Core Value is listed at the top of the cub-o-gram that is sent out at the beginning of each month)

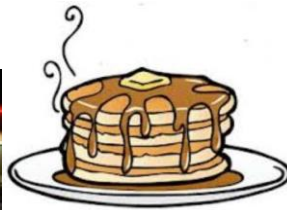

A Special Pack 40 Tribute



David J. Godbout

David J. Godbout, 48, a lifelong area resident, died on Tuesday, August 26, 2014 at Vassar Brothers Medical Center following a long illness.

Born in North Tarrytown on October 6, 1965, he was the son of the late Roland and Margaret Fagan Godbout. Dave had served in the US Army and was employed as a laborer with Local #235 in Elmsford for 25 years. He was an avid hunter and fisherman, and a member of the Bethlehem Rod & Gun Club. He was also a huge fan of the New York Yankees and Giants. **He volunteered as Assistant Scoutmaster for Cub Scout Pack 40 of Wappingers Falls.**

Pack 40 placed the Cub Scout Flag on his coffin as a tribute to him.



He was very down to earth and gentle hearted, those that had the honor to work with him will miss him dearly.
